I would like to congratulate you, your staff and pupils on the outstanding progress your pupils are making and your school's high level of EBacc entry in 2018.

Your school's Progress 8 score of 0.84 which is well above the national average, shows that you are amongst the top 4 per cent of state-funded mainstream schools in terms of the progress your pupils make between key stage 2 and the end of key stage 4.

With 75 per cent of your pupils entering the EBacc in 2018, your school is in the top 11 per cent of all state-funded mainstream secondary schools in the country. EBacc subjects provide a sound basis for careers beyond the age of 16 and can also enrich pupils' studies, giving them a broad general knowledge that will enable them to participate in and contribute to society.

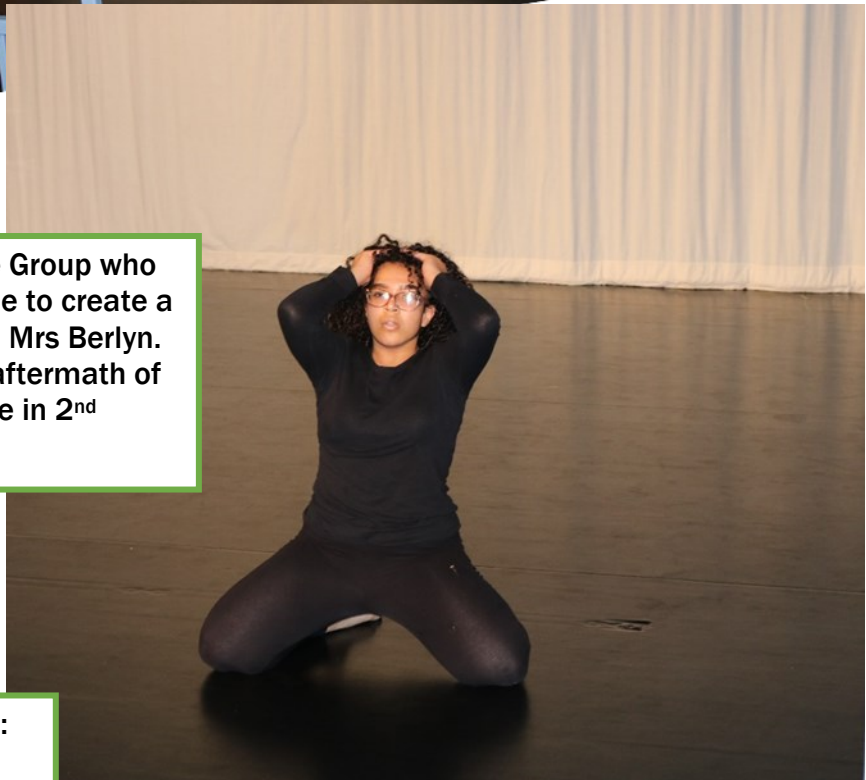

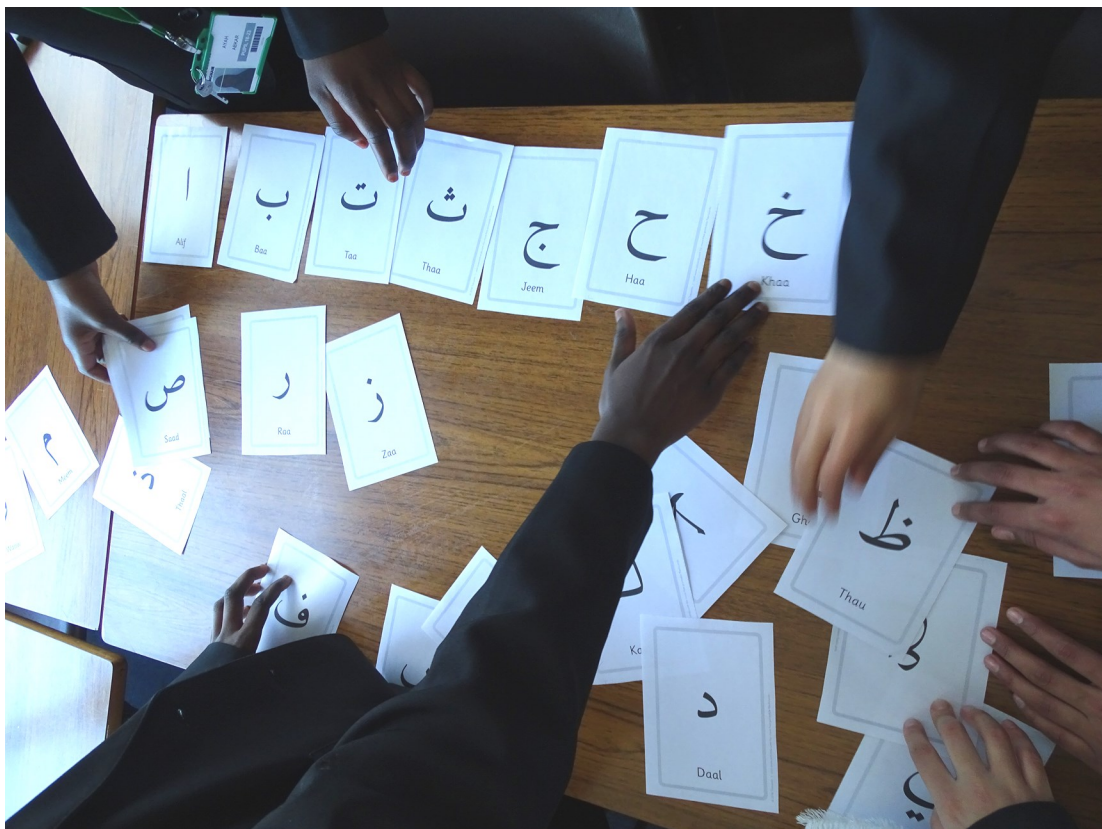

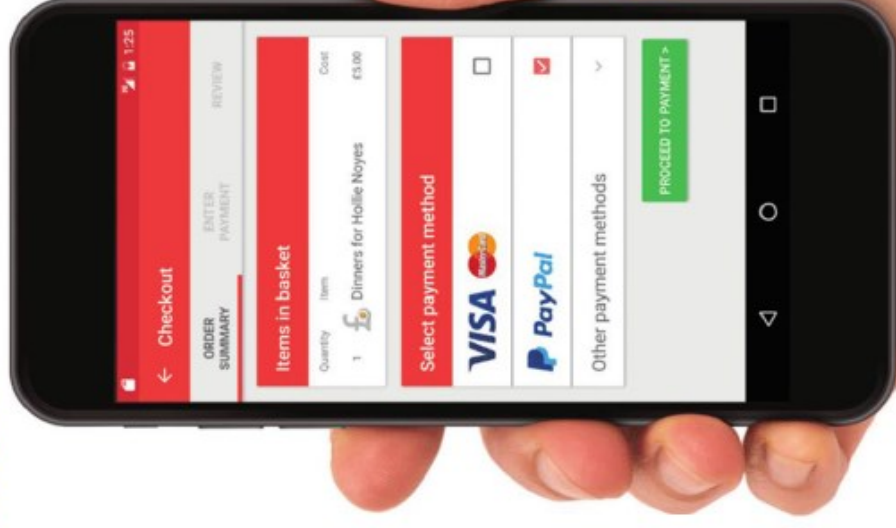

# Physical Education News

## School Games – Indoor Athletics

On Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> April, Hillcrest Year 7 and Year 8 indoor athletic teams represented the Shenley Partnership at the Birmingham School Games. The standard at the competition was extremely high and our students worked incredibly hard in their events, particularly on the track. The Year 8 team finished in 5<sup>th</sup> place overall and the Year 7s finished 4<sup>th</sup> just missing the third spot by a few points.

There were some excellent individual performances. Brooklyn was the winner of the year 7 shot with a throw exceeding 7.50m with Awa also scoring valuable points. In the vertical, triple and long jumps, Shahd, Adeola, Marwa and Alyssa put in excellent performances. Mosope and Adeola finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 8 lap parlaaf and the sprint relay team of Alyssa, Adeola, Barakah and Marwa won their event.

For the Year 8 students, Kayarn worked so hard for the team competing in three track and two field events. Saba finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the triple jump which she completed following a gruelling parlaaf with Kayarn. Abrar also had a tough distance run and then pulled a super speed bounce and triple jump out of the bag. Elizabeth paced herself well in her 4 lap race earning good points for the team. Christina also scored well for the team in the shot having stepped in at the last minute and Crystal, Kiera and Natasha ran a blistering first leg in the relay.





### **School Games - Badminton**

Hillcrest students also represented the partnership in the Badminton competition. Our Senior team of Hajra (who didn't lose a match in the qualifying rounds) Melisa, Faith, Elisha and Esther won through to the Champions play-off, eventually finishing in 4<sup>th</sup> place behind King Edwards Camp Hill A and B teams and King Edwards High School. It was a tremendous all round performance, congratulations to the girls involved.

Our Junior team of Iman, Chelsea, Melanie, Holly-Leigh and Fatou also performed extremely well in what was only their second competition. They finished in 5<sup>th</sup> place but had one of the most exciting doubles matches of the day against St Thomas Aquinas school which we eventually won. Well done to all girls involved.

As a result of our participation in this event we were able to speak to the area development officer for badminton and having seen the enthusiasm of the team, she is hopefully going to be able to offer some coaching in the future for our talented players.

# DRAMA



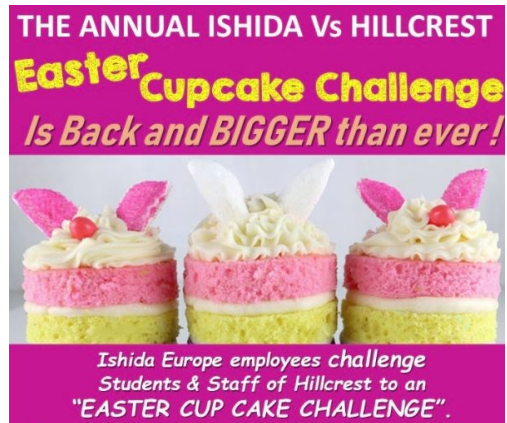
A Level Drama students came from Sandwell and Dudley College to perform their 'Theatre in Education' devised piece to the Year 10 GCSE Drama students.

# A Message from the Headteacher



It's been another busy half term at Hillcrest with students and staff working extremely hard on their preparations for external and internal examinations.

Please encourage students to keep reviewing their learning during the holiday to ensure that their hard work is rewarded when they receive their examination results. Self-testing is a key way for students to see what they know and what they still need to spend time learning. Ask your child to show you how they use the different Learning Scientists strategies and visit the website <http://www.learningscientists.org> and how they use Active Learn, Hegarty Maths and Seneca Learning.

Examinations can be a stressful time for young people and their families and it's important to make sure that the hard work is balanced with plenty of exercise, a healthy diet and periods of relaxation. Making sure work at home is in 30 minute slots with 10 minute breaks and a longer break after 2 hours is really important.
