From the smallest cells to the largest galaxies, join us to explore the universe around us. Meet female scientists from the University of Birmingham, who will run each weekly session.





Sessions planned include: making snow slime, using cabbage as a universal indicator, making your own lava lamp, rocket race.




Indoor Rowing

The Hillcrest Indoor Rowing team will once again represent the partnership at the School Games. With funding from the school, we have been able to pay for extra coaching from Birmingham Rowing to improve our technique and stamina.

The teams performed extremely well last year and we will be working hard to achieve a similar performance this time round.

Indoor Athletics

The Year 7 and Year 8 Indoor Athletics teams trained very hard in preparation for the Level 2 Competition on 5th December, and although the Year 8 team are the reigning Birmingham School Games champions, they still needed to perform at their very best to qualify this year.

The competition was extremely exciting and in the Year 7 competition it was very close. There were some outstanding performances. In Year 7, Adeola was immense in the sprints and jumps. Brooklyn who shot putt so much further than anyone else, including Year 8. Awa, who timed her distance run perfectly, and Alyssa who so calmly and convincingly won the 200m. In the Year 8 team, Kayarn again won the sprint and vertical jump. Sabah remains undefeated in the triple and long jump, and Abrar, whose training helped her to comfortably win the distance event. It is, however, very much a team event and these performances alone would not be enough to win, therefore, we waited anxiously for the final results.

The eruption of cheers, applause, and jumping up and down from our teams was fully deserved. Not only will the Year 8 team be able to defend their title, but the Year 7 team will also have the opportunity to compete at a higher level, as both teams successfully won and will represent the partnership at the Birmingham School Games on April 3rd 2019. 




Year 9 Physics BIG QUIZ




The Year 10 GCSE Drama students travelled to London to participate in a student conference led by a Drama examiner.

A Message from the Headteacher



A huge 'thank you' to all students and staff for your hard work this half-term. You can see from this edition of the messenger that although it's been a short (6 week) half term, there have been lots of events and activities inside and outside the normal timetabled lessons and lots more planned from after half term.

Looking ahead, the examination period for Year 11 and 13 students is almost here and they are working really hard in preparation for GCSE, BTEC and A level examinations in May and June. It's important that they use the half term holiday to catch-up with revision (and some sleep!)

As I write this, there are 44 school days until the first GCSE and A level external written examinations, and many of the external practical examinations are already underway. Year 8 will have examinations in March, Year 7 in May, Year 10 in June and Year 9 in July.

Revision is an extremely important skill that all students, in all year groups, need to practise and make part of their everyday approach to study. When revising, students need a quiet environment without disturbances, plenty of sleep, regular breaks, plenty of water, and lots of encouragement.

The work of the Learning Scientists is key to successful revision and staff at Hillcrest help students to develop their use of these effective learning strategies from Year 7 onwards.
