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Introduction

As per Step 4 of government's plan, all measures have been lifted from 19 July 2021 for the full return of all pupils : <u>https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/actions-for-schools-during-the-coronavirus-outbreak/schools-coronavirus-covid-19-operational-guidances</u>, published by the Department for Education (DfE).

Schools and settings will only need to implement some, or all, of the measures in this plan in response to recommendations provided by the local authority (LA), directors of public health (DsPH), Public Health England (PHE) health protection team or the national government.

It may be necessary to implement these measures in the following circumstances:

> To help manage a COVID-19 outbreak within the school / setting. Actions will need to be considered when either of the following thresholds are met:

For most settings:

- There are 5 positive cases amongst pupils or staff who are likely to have mixed closely within a 10-day period
- 10% of pupils or staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive within a 10-day period
- > If COVID-19 infection rates in the community are extremely high, and other measures have failed to reduce transmission
- > As part of a package of measures responding to a 'variant of concern' (VoC)
- > To prevent unsustainable pressure on the NHS

When one of the thresholds above is met, schools and settings will need to review the testing, hygiene and ventilation measures already in place.

	In the event of an outbreak or contact with a positive case staff who are fully vaccinated are advised to take additional LFD tests (on a daily basis) and book a PCR test if they are a significant close contact. Staff who are not vaccinated will need to follow advice from Track and Trace. Any staff or students who are identified as a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of Covid-19, irrespective of vaccination status and age, will be contacted by Test and Trace (to self-isolate immediately and book a PCR test)
2. Face Coverings	
 If recommended, pupils, staff and visitors who are not exempt from wearing a face covering: Should be asked to keep on or put on a face covering when arriving at school and moving around indoors in places where social distancing is difficult to maintain, such as in communal areas And/or: Should be asked to wear a face covering in classrooms or during activities, unless social distancing can be maintained or a face covering would impact on the ability to take part in exercise or strenuous activity In some circumstances, transparent face coverings, which may assist communication with someone who relies on lip reading, clear sound or facial expression to communicate, can also be worn. Transparent face coverings may be effective in reducing the spread of COVID-19. 	Communicated to staff, parents/guardians and students.
